INTRODUCTION

Every two years, Workforce Solutions compiles a list of occupations that are now in demand in the Houston-Galveston Gulf Coast region, or ones that will be in the future. In addition, you will also find:

- the median hourly wage (based on 2011 industry standards),

- the employment growth for each occupation as a percentage.

Criteria used to identify these occupations are:

- Projected employment for 2020 equal to or greater than the average for all occupations in the region.
- Projected growth rate equal to or greater than the average of all occupations in the region.
- Minimum education requirements of a postsecondary degree or certificate, long-term on-the-job training or work experience in a related occupation.
- Median hourly wages equal to or greater than the median for all occupations in the region.

There are also indicators of which occupations are supported by Workforce Solutions' scholarships.
